Prof. Birte Melsen



The name behind The Aarhus System™ is one of the most recognized in orthodontics today. Professor Birte Melsen has held the title of Professor and Chairman of the Department of Orthodontics at the Royal College, Aarhus, Denmark since 1975 – a 35 year tenure. She is the author of more than 300 published scientific articles covering a broad range of topics, holds countless honors for her contributions to orthodontics, and is recognized by her peers as a premier researcher and academic.

Professor Melsen’s interest and work in Skeletal Anchorage began in the 1970’s with Jens Kølsten Pedersen. In 1996, after more than 20 years of investigation, the Aarhus Mini-Implant System was introduced. Today we see the culmination of Professor Birte Melsen’s continuing research, development, and over 35 years of dedication to this field.
